She specialises in regional security, diplomacy, and media representation in Central Asia. Her researches focus at examining how newspapers and digital media shape perceptions of China's role in the region, with particular attention to state-controlled narratives and independent journalism.

She specializes in international relations, political framing, and China-Central Asia diplomacy. Her research focuses on political communication, strategic narratives, and foreign policy analysis.
